This may also be due to teams qualifying and traveling to National Tournaments. Tournament travel varies each year per team. Not all teams may qualify to play in the national tournament; the days they participate can vary, along with distance traveled due to tournament site changes each year.

## **OVERALL REVENUES AND EXPENSES**

Expenses include appearance guarantees and options, athletically-related student aid, contract services, equipment , fund-raising activity, operating expense, promotional activities, recruiting expense, salaries and benefits supplies, travel and any other expense attributed to inter collegiate activities. Debt service and capital expense are not included in these totals.
